<u>Chapel Haddlesey Wellbeing Award – part of The White Rose Federation</u>

<u>Message from Sam Maud</u> - The White Rose Federation Pastoral team worked hard over an 18-month period to achieve the 'Wellbeing Award for Schools'. This reinforces our ongoing support with the children, their families, staff and local community putting wellbeing at the heart of what we do.

The three schools within the federation achieved the awards after showing their commitment towards: reducing stigma around mental health, developing strategies to improve pupil behaviour, building positive pupil wellbeing, supporting staff and parental wellbeing.

Colin Noble, the Wellbeing assessor, stated, "The strengths identified were numerous. The staff really did know their families and children (and each other) very well indeed and how their needs could best be met; and they quite tangibly cared for them deeply as individuals."















I am proud to be part of the Federation Pastoral team - our dedication and commitment to our families is special and the support we offer breaks down any barriers to learning.

Pupil Absences



It is important that you please make sure you telephone or email the school before 9.10am to notify us of any child absence, with a reason for their absence. Equally, we ask if your child is unwell and you have called on the first day of their absence, we also require a call on each subsequent day until they are well enough to be back in school. If we do not receive any communication, by phone or email, we start our process of contacting all the contacts allocated to your child and if we still haven't received any information, the Children Missing in Education protocol is triggered.

Thank you for your cooperation with this.

- A child who has been given antibiotics should be kept away from school for the first 48 hours of treatment.
- A child who has been sick or who has diarrhoea should also be kept away from school until the child has been clear of the problem for 48 hours.
- Medical/dental appointments should be made out of school hours; however where this is not possible the school will require notification prior to the absence. When a child is absent for a medical appointment it is expected that they will return to school immediately following the appointment.

Please contact the office for further guidance on specific illnesses and required length of absence.

It is crucial that parents please adhere to this procedure to ensure that all pupils are safe and their whereabouts accounted for.

Universal free school meals for infants

If your child is in Reception, Year One or Year Two they are automatically entitled to a Free School Meal, funded by the government. Parents who are on benefits and meet the above criteria are still encouraged to apply for free school meal funding, known as pupil premium funding. This benefits the school and helps increase your child's attainment. So please follow the link above and find out how to apply.

If you find that you would like to look at the menu again to make new choices for your child's school meals or would like them to swap from packed lunches to school meals, as the weather gets colder, please email Mrs Charlton for a copy of our current menus which can also be found on our website. Our school dinner menus change from Monday, 6th November and copies will be sent home with your children before the end of this half-term for you to make your choices.

Partnership with Recycling



For over a year we have been collecting bottle tops in school to send to SchoolCycled. This is an initiative by MYgroup, designed to educate the next generation about recycling, fragile ecosystems and sustainability. Their innovation in recycling allows them to process many of the items that would ordinarily end up landfilled or incinerated, the so-called 'hard-to-recycle' wastes. They provide schools with furniture, play equipment, signage and bins made from the recycled waste we have provided by giving us earth

points for every kilogram of bottle caps we collect, that we can spend on the items we choose. We currently have 20,270 earth points! Please keep collecting your plastic bottle tops; they can be from coffee jars, shampoo bottles, sports drinks, fabric softener bottles, milk carton lids etc and send them into school with your child(ren). We hope to save up enough Earth Points to purchase something for the Early Years area initially.

We were contacted by Eggborough Methodist Church who had read about our involvement with the SchoolCycled scheme, and they have set up a collection for their residents to support our school. A representative of the church said that they like to help with any local charity in any way they can and already collect used postage stamps for the RNLI. Mrs Charlton suggested that the school could return the favour by collecting postage stamps for them to send to the RNLI. If you have received any envelopes with postage stamps on, please cut around them (around 1cm) and send to school for Mrs Charlton to forward to Eggborough Methodist Church.



ScholarPack Texts and Emails

Our communication system with Parents is with a system called ScholarPack. We can send you emails via this system, but you are unable to reply to those emails. If you need to email the school, please use the email address above. We often send out text messages, but only have 160 characters in which to convey a message, so please do not think we are being short or rude if there are no greetings in them. If a child bumps their head whilst at school we send a text for awareness only, so that you know to look for a bump note at the end of the day. This is so that you are aware of a bump should they become unwell. We would ring home if it was a serious bump.

<u>Supervision of Younger Siblings on School Premises</u>

Could we please ask that any younger siblings are closely supervised whilst on the school site at drop off and collection times. They should always remain with an adult and must not be allowed to climb on/use any of the equipment in the playground.

It is imperative that we hold the most up to date information for your child and have the relevant permissions in place to for the academic year. Please return all forms by Friday 29th September. If you need to request a paper copy, please email Mrs Charlton in the office.















Water

Fresh, chilled drinking water is available for all pupils throughout the day and pupils will be encouraged to drink water at frequent intervals. All packed lunch pupils have access to water at lunch time meaning there is no need for an additional drink to be brought as part of a packed lunch. Pupils are encouraged to bring a water bottle every day that they can refill as necessary. Bottles go home at the end of every day to be washed and returned.

No drinks other than water should be brought into school by pupils unless recommended by a doctor for medical needs. Please refrain from adding ANY medications to your child's water, unless the necessary Medicine Form has been completed and handed to your child's class teacher, along with the water bottle.

An update of when payment items are added to ParentPay:-

Breakfast club and **meals** are added on a Friday for the week just attended.

Out of school club is added the day after attendance at the club (Friday is added on a Monday).

Nursery fees are added at the start of each half term.

There is a payment item called Uniform Donations on ParentPay that can be used to pay for any items bought from the PTA as they will regularly be selling pre-loved uniform items.

Could we please remind everyone to check your ParentPay balances regularly and ensure that any outstanding amounts are cleared. Across the federation, there is an agreed maximum debt per child, which is £30.00. This includes any nursery fees, school dinners, ad-hoc payments and out of school club.

Attendance update from Sam Maud:

Regular attendance at school ensures that children get the best possible start in life. Good attendance supports learning, the development of social skills and friendships as well as building good habits that are essential for adult life. School education lays the vital foundations of a child's life. Research clearly demonstrates the link between regular attendance and educational progress and attainment. Parents/carers and the school staff should work in partnership in making education a success and in ensuring that all children have full and equal access to all that the school has to offer.

What is the expected attendance for primary school children?

The Government expect that pupils attend school for at least 96% of the school year. We strive to achieve at least 97% attendance across all our classes within the White Rose Federation. If your child's level of absence concerns us or attendance falls below 95%, you may be contacted by the school to look at what support can be offered to improve attendance. We want to work with you to ensure we give your child the best opportunities to grow and succeed.

Attendance that falls below 90% is categorised as persistent absence.

An attendance figure of 90% is the equivalent of a half day absence every week. If your child is persistently absent several things may happen depending upon the reasons for absence and your child's previous attendance record. You may receive a letter, an invitation to an attendance meeting, a home visit or, in serious cases, your child's attendance may be closely monitored, and you may be asked to provide medical proof of absence.

How can you support good attendance in school?

- Take trips during school holidays rather than in term-time
- Don't allow your child to stay off school for a minor ailment
- Ensure your child has a good understanding of why attendance is important
- Figure out the reasons for absence as this can help you understand where your child needs support in overcoming barriers to attending school
- Try to establish a good routine early so that when your child does start school, they practise good habits such as getting plenty of sleep
- If appointments are needed for health reasons, try to make them during after school hours or out of term time where possible
- Offer support with homework and take an interest in their learning
- Attend parents' evenings to discuss your child's progress

Good attendance is linked to success in all aspects of life!
