




# Class 2 - What are we learning this term?

#### Science

This term sees the arrival of some live science in Class 2. Thanks to a wonderful Chapel Haddlesey family, we now have tadpoles in class! We will be observing them closely for signs of changes and growth. Once we have observed changes over the coming week or two, the tadpoles will be released into the newly created nature pond in our peace garden.

We will also welcome some very special eggs into class on the 22<sup>nd</sup> of April. Our chicks will arrive in a specialist incubator that allows us to observe them as they hatch. We will explore how to meet the needs of our new arrivals and learn about things animals need to survive. # **Homework**

Homework will be set on a weekly basis via Purple Mash. Homework will be set on a Friday and due in the following Thursday.

Year 4 children are asked to focus on their multiplication skills ahead of our Multiplication check in June.

Our focus text will be The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe, by C.S. Lewis.

We will delve into the world of setting descriptions, fairytales, and adventure stories as we write our own version of this much-loved classic.

We will also combine our art learning with our literacy towards the end of the term, writing non-chronological reports and biographies of Dame Barbara Hepworth and Henry Moore.

#### RE

Year 3 and 4 children will begin comparing similarities and differences between all religions taught so far, discovering how each one promotes being a 'good person' and 'making positive choices and contributions.'

Year 2 children will learn more about the way in which different religions suggest how we should care for those around us and the world in which we live.

#### **Maths**

This term we will begin by consolidating our learning of fractions and decimals and recapping our learning from the previous two terms. We will then explore statistics and how this relates to the real-world context of our lives outside of school. We will then complete our new maths learning by focusing on measures, exploring mass and capacity. This is a particularly exciting unit of work as we use our learning to bake!

To round off the year, we will consolidate all of our learning, recapping all our past maths adventures!
