Crucial Crew - Year 6

The **Year 6** children will be attending the Crucial Crew Event on **Wednesday 17th July**. This event is vital in encouraging good citizenship to assist in reducing accidents, injuries, anti-social behaviour, and crime, as well as protecting young people through education and awareness. This event is designed to educate pupils in North Yorkshire to make informed decisions when faced with stressful, emotional, dangerous or 'risky' situations. The event encourages active participation by all children and shows synchronicity between the Crucial Crew event and the schools citizenship curriculum (PSHE). **On the day, we ask that the children come to school in full uniform please and bring a water bottle.**

Leavers Assembly

Please join us in The Church Hall on **Thursday 18th July from 1.30pm** as we say goodbye to our Year 6 children. This is always an emotional event, so don't forget those tissues! Class 3 will also be performing a 25-minute version of 'Much Ado About Nothing'.

Belongings

On the last day of term, please ensure that your child collects all of their belongings from school, as the classrooms and cloakrooms will be cleared out and cleaned in preparation for the new school year in September. Any items left behind that are named will be returned to your child in September, but we don't have the capacity to keep any unnamed items, so they will be offered to the PTA if in good condition or discarded.

Reception Tapestry Journals

Parents of the children who are currently in Class 1 are aware that we use Tapestry to keep a journal of their child's learning journey for Nursery and Reception children, both in school and parents can also add to this at home and for sharing images of events in Class 1 for Year 1 children. If your child is in Year 1, please note that your child's Tapestry journal ends on Friday, 19th July. You will receive an email shortly after this date, inviting you to download your child's journal. If you are unable to access this and need a downloaded copy, please contact Mrs Charlton. The staff in Class 1 hope that you like your child's journal and will keep it as a fitting reminder of their first years in formal education.
