### Non-uniform day



### Non-uniform day for The Clothing Bank

Mrs Thornton works closely with local charities that, on occasion, help out some of our families. Recently she has been speaking to The Clothing Bank and they are lacking in donations at the moment, so Mrs Thornton came up with idea of 'Clothes for Clothes'. Instead of making a cash donation on ParentPay, we are asking that children bring in an item of clothing to donate to The Clothing Bank. It can be children or adult clothing, and we ask that it is in good, clean condition. They are especially short of underwear, but we would ask that these donations would be new items. We will be holding the non-uniform day on Friday 8<sup>th</sup> April.



### Outstanding ParentPay debts

Across the federation, there is an agreed maximum debt per child, which is £30.00. This includes any nursery fees, school dinners and out of school club payments. Please keep an eye on your child's account and make payment as soon as possible, thank you.



### Pupil absences

It is really important that you please make sure you telephone or email the school before 9.15am to notify us of any child absence, with a reason for their absence, even for Nursery children. On the first day of their absence, we also require a call on **each subsequent day** until they are well enough to be back. Equally, we ask if your child is unwell and you have called in school. If we don't receive any communication, by phone or email, we start our process of contacting all of the contacts allocated to your child and if we still haven't received any information, the Children Missing in Education protocol is triggered. Thank you for your cooperation with this. Any covid absences should be emailed to the [covid@wrfed.co.uk](mailto:covid@wrfed.co.uk) email address.

### Medicines in school

If you require your child to have medicine administered during the course of a school day, please complete a 'Parental Request for Medicine in School' form, available from the School Office and the school website. We are not allowed to administer any medicine without this being completed fully and signed by a parent/carer and the Headteacher/Head of School. If your child requires a course of antibiotics for example, over a period of a few days, please ensure that the medicine is handed directly in to the School Office each morning. Whilst we can administer Calpol (or similar Paracetamol-based medicines), we are not insured to administer any Ibuprofen medication sent in, unless this is prescribed by a doctor.



### Car Park reminder

When parking in the Community Hall car park we ask that all families reverse park into the spaces as this gives better visibility when moving around. Could we also ask that the reserved space for Miss Hannah is kept free on the days on the reserved board. Could pedestrians please use the footpath/grass verge to navigate your way around the car park.

### Wellbeing Award for Schools

Research shows that the Wellbeing Award for Schools has had an impact in six key areas:

1. Reduce stigma around mental health
2. Improve Pupil behaviour
3. Improve Pupil wellbeing
4. Improve staff wellbeing
5. Improve parental wellbeing
6. Improve staff morale

To achieve the award, the school goes through a process of self-evaluation, action planning, portfolio building and finally verification to show we have achieved the necessary standards.

#### Self-evaluation

We will evaluate our provision using questionnaires for staff, pupils and parents which will identify current strengths and areas for improvement. We will gather the feedback to ensure a whole-school approach.

#### Action planning

We will create an action plan that targets specific areas for improvement and identify the steps needed.

A Change Team is established to help drive through these actions across the school.

#### Portfolio building

We will collect evidence to show that we have the evidence to meet the award framework and highlight our successes and achievements.

#### Verification

Schools are visited by a trained award verifier who collaboratively assesses the evidence. The award takes between 12-15 months to complete and we hope for your support during this process.

Good attendance is linked to success in all aspects of life!

Whole school attendance target is: 97%

This fortnight whole school attendance was: 90.90%

### How can I support good attendance?

There is support if you are finding school attendance a problem, if your child is anxious or worried about going to school please do ask for help.

Every child is entitled to additional support from the school to help them engage with learning, as a Federation we have a Pastoral team that can support you as a family to achieve this. Some children may find regular support helps to improve school attendance.

### Attendance top tips

- Figure out the reasons for absence as this can help you understand where your child needs support in overcoming barriers to attending school
- Try to establish a good routine early so that when your child does start school they are in good habits such as getting plenty of sleep
- If appointments are needed for health reasons, try to make them during after school hours or out of term time where possible
- Offer support with homework and take an interest in their learning
- Attend parents' evenings to discuss your child's progress
- Take trips during school holidays rather than term time



- Don't allow your child to stay off school for a minor ailment
- Ensure your child has a good understanding of why attendance is important
